Rackham rules govern the double counting of credits. At the current time, Rackham policies state the following: Not more than one-sixth of the credits required for a master’s degree may be double-counted with a certificate. Not more than half of the credits necessary for a certificate that requires 10 or more credits of coursework may be double-counted with a master’s. This means, for instance, that for any student enrolled in a master’s program that requires 36 or more credit hours (as is the case in Taubman, Public Health, and the Ford School), students are allowed to double-count six credit hours toward both their master’s degree and the proposed certificate.
