\*Architecture Ph.D. Students have <u>one non-working</u> term within their four year full-funding package, to be used at their discretion, often during coursework or when preparing for the Preliminary Exam. \*\*Working term = Assigned as a Graduate Student Instructor (GSI) or Graduate Student Research Assistant (GSRA). Appointment is at a 50% rate. (includes full tuition waiver & stipend) \*\*\*Students may be offered Rackham One-term Dissertation Grant or must apply to other competitive funding programs (e.g. Rackham Predoctoral Fellowship, or other UM and non-UM funding)

### **Estimated Cost of Attendance**

A stipend is a monthly payment provided to you to cover living & misc expenses. All Ph.D. students are provided a 50% stipend rate. Stipends are provided for fall, winter, and spring/summer terms for 4 years.

## **STIPEND RATES:**

Current .50 stipend: \$13,770 per term / \$3,442 per month (2024-2025). New rates will be final in July 2025.

Tuition is assessed once you have registered for coursework. All Ph.D. students are provided full-tuition waivers for up to 6 years.

### **HEALTH INSURANCE:**

All Ph.D. students and any dependents are provided health insurance during fall, winter and spring/summer terms of your entire program of study. Health insurance: \$4,830 per year (based on you only)

All such awards are contingent upon satisfactory completion of program requirements in a timely fashion. The University requires background checks for all individuals who have an appointment or employment at the University. Because your funding offer includes your appointment as a graduate student instructor (GSI) or graduate student research assistant (GSRA), and/or graduate student staff assistant (GSSA), a background check prior to your first appointment in any one of these positions is needed. Your funding commitment is contingent upon the successful completion of a background check, which includes the successful resolution of any issues that might arise, prior to the commencement of your first appointment.
