- \$25,000 Scholarship
- To support a Michigan resident with tuition and related expenses for Masters level, Doctoral level, or advanced research pursuits at an accredited public or private college or university in Michigan.
- Application required
- Due April 15, 2025

Paying for Your Degree

Cost of Attendance

Direct Costs

Paid DIRECTLY to the university (billed each term/semester):

- Tuition and fees
- Housing and meal plan (if living on campus)

Indirect Costs

Paid to others and can include:

- Books and supplies
- Personal/miscellaneous items
- Transportation
- Off-campus housing and food

Books & Course Materials, Supplies & Equipment	\$1,200	\$1,200
Living Expenses (varies by student)	\$22,000	\$22,000
Transportation	\$400	\$400
Misc Personal	\$6,644	\$6,644
Total	\$68,847	\$86,501



Types of Aid

Scholarships/Fellowships & Grants

- Graduate Urban Planning Grant: Based on FAFSA
 - \$20,000 (\$10,000 per year)

Private and Federal Loans

- Federal loan options FAFSA required
- Unsubsidized Direct Loans Max. \$20,500/academic year (two semesters); interest accrual begins day 1
- <u>Graduate PLUS Loans</u> must apply separately at studentaid.gov; can borrow up to Cost of Attendance minus other aid



Types of Aid

"Earned Money" - Work-Study

- Eligibility determined by FAFSA
- Earn up to amount on Aid Notice
- Bi-monthly paychecks
- Flexible work schedules
- On- or off-campus opportunities

How to Apply for Aid

Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) | <u>studentaid.gov</u>

- Determines eligibility for federal Work-Study and unsubsidized loans
- U.S. Citizens, Permanent Residents, Eligible Non-Citizens
- Annual application; available October 1 each year



Financial Aid Example

Example Cost of Attendance (Fall Semester): \$30,000

Example Aid Package (Fall Semester):

- Scholarships: \$5,000
- Federal Unsubsidized Loan: \$10,250
- Federal Graduate PLUS Loan: \$14,750 (separate application)

<u>Total Aid</u>

\$30,000

Q: How much will they receive as a refund for housing, books, etc.? A: \$12,000 (Fall semester) -> Approx \$3,000/month

- OFA Off-Campus Resources Worksheet
- Financial aid only provided during months enrolled
 - 12-month leases common in Ann Arbor
- Financial aid refund if aid exceeds U-M bill for tuition and fees
 - Lump sum at beginning of term/semester
 - Rent, utilities, food are educational expenses



Child Care Subsidy Program

- finaid.umich.edu/types-aid/child-care-subsidy
- Assistance with child care costs from licensed State of Michigan providers
 - Children 12 or under
 - Children under 19 with special needs

Application Requirements

- 1) Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)
- 2) CCS Application Opens May (Fall-Winter) & February (Spring/Summer)
- Funded on a first-come, first served basis; apply as soon as possible



Financial Aid Disbursement

- Billing invoices issued by Student Financial Services, not OFA
- Aid disbursed to students <u>10 days</u> before start of term
- First, aid pays charges on U-M student account/bill
- Refund issued if financial aid exceeds account charges
- Direct deposit enrollment on Wolverine Access under Student Business > Payroll and Compensation



SFS Handles Billing

Office of Financial Aid

- Verifies information on FAFSA
- Determines eligibility for:
 - Work-Study
 - Unsubsidized & PLUS Loans
- Certification of private loans
- Issues financial aid refunds
- Special circumstances related to FAFSA

Student Financial Services

- Sends billing invoices and notifications
- Administers payment plans
- Processes payments
- Issues payment-related refunds
- Assesses late payment fees

When to Contact OFA

- FAFSA-related special circumstances
 - Change in employment student or spouse (if married)
 - Significant out-of-pocket medical expenses
 - One-time income on tax return/FAFSA
- Loan changes increase, decrease, or cancellation
- Cost of Attendance (COA) adjustment
- Child Care Subsidy <u>finaid-childcare@umich.edu</u>

- Determined by the Registrar's Office

 - 1) legal resident of the State of Michigan;
 - 2) attended accredited Michigan middle and high schools; or
 - 3) personal or family military service

- "Next Steps" includes important loan information
- 4) Apply for scholarships
- 5) Apply for Work-Study positions
