We will explore these histories through hegemonic and counter hegemonic frameworks that scholars and critics have employed such as 'alternative modernisms', 'multiple modernisms', and 'global modernisms'. Throughout the course will examine architectural modernisms' historical antecedents, various manifestations and offshoots, as well as the philosophies and forms that developed in response.
